## This month's year group focus:

#### Year 5

The children in 5OT and 5CB have all been studying the text 'Queen Elizabeth II' as part of their Whole Class Reading lessons.

They have been developing their retrieval skills in these lessons.

One child said, "To retrieve an answer I read the question and highlight the important words like who or where. Then I scan the text to find the answer. I read the question again and write my answer down. Then I check it."



Meet Rex Retriever – the dog who helps us learn how to locate answers to questions in the texts we read.

# Find ways to make reading fun!

- Invite a character to dinner. Plan a menu the character would like.
- Take turns to read parts of the book aloud.
- What simple—and necessary—activity involves reading and math? Cooking! And it's something you and your child can do together every day!
