Pinfold Street Primary School has been awarded the Food for Life Bronze award for its healthy and climate-friendly food culture.

The school is working with Food for Life to transform the school's food culture and that of its local community, by connecting the children with climate-friendly and healthy food.

As part of the Bronze award scheme, Pinfold Street serves seasonal school meals, 75% of which are freshly prepared by experienced school cook, Sam Bird, of Walsall Catering Services.

The school also gives every pupil the opportunity to visit a farm, cook and participate in food growing activities during his or her time at school, and pupils and parents are involved in making improvements to the school's menu and dining experience.

We have achieved a Skills Builder Silver Award

Skills builder helps us to provide opportunities for children to develop essential skills like communication, collaboration, creative problem solving and self-management.
